**Quorum:** Shanna established a quorum.

**Orientation:** Denise discussed the documents in Google Drive. Denise reminded everyone to review the documents and pay attention to upcoming deadlines.

### Consent agenda

**Katilyn Slaton, chair of the board:** I attended ASRT House of Delegates in Reno in June as an affiliate delegate. I attended the MRI, CT, and Education chapter meetings. Each meeting discussed different content. MRI focused on enforcing having two Level 2 employees to a scanner for safety reasons, discussed doing away with the post-primary pathway, and discussed remote pacemaker interrogation (with no representative present). CT chapter heard from the military chapter about the difficulty of sitting for the registry because of their short timeframe before deployment. The education chapter discussed ChatGPT and how students are using it to submit assignments and research papers. There were no changes that will impact our bylaws this year. There were late main motions that were heavily discussed, however only one passed referring to equitable care to patients. It was an honor to represent KSRT this year at the House of Delegates. Thank you to Jen, Denise, Kyle, and Toni for giving me clarification on some of the HOD procedures when late motions got a bit complicated.

**Gale Brown, immediate past president:** Information pertaining to ASRT Student Leadership Development Program (SLDP) was emailed out to the Labette Community College radiology students along with encouraging several students to get involved with the KSRT. There were no bylaws changes during the ASRT House of Delegates meeting.

**Denise Orth, president:** In the past few months, I have reached out to Heidi Chermak to notify her of the board's decision to add her as a co-

ea representative. Heidi accepted the appointment and will work with Kirsten Oswald to represent the east area of the state. I also updated the Google Drive with documentation, finalized affiliate compliance documentation in the ASRT portal, let ASRT know we want to select our own SLDP students, applied for AFP money (to help pay for a new printer, lapel microphones, luggage carts, and a computer for the *Rotating Anode* editor), sent email correspondence to the board for updates on action items everyone is working on, conducted a special email vote to pay Kyle Ibarra for expenses incurred as the alternate delegate for ASRT HOD, and provided a president's letter and information for the SLDP to Jen for *The Rotating Anode*. **Fellows committee chair:** I have reached out to members who are Fellows to assist with updating the guidelines. Megan Rucker and Linda Croucher will be working with me to review guidelines of the ASRT and Missouri. At this time, we have not made any decision as it is still too early in the process. **Executive secretary:** In an effort to streamline the process for banking I have setup Excel spreadsheets for the checkbook, income, and expenses to move away from the paper format of a check register and checks. I have been in contact with Sunflower Bank to help me have our account moved to online bill pay. Currently we have two certificates of deposit with First Internet Bank of Indiana with the \$37,925.79 CD maturing Nov. 15. The board typically has gone with a 36-month term but that doesn't have to happen. I would like to have a decision made at the September board meeting, with a vote, so that close to the due date I can implement the decision the board makes. Options (as of Aug. 27) are First Internet Bank of Indiana: 12-month CD at 5.22%, 18-month CD at 4.96%, 24-month CD at 4.75%, and 36-month CD at 4.65%; and Sunflower Bank: 14-month CD at 5.50%, and 12-23 month at 4%.

**Toni Caldwell, president-elect:** I have reached out to an MRI technologist about speaking at convention, picked up one silent auction item, will speak to Washburn radiology students

about the KSRT and SLDP at the beginning of September, and worked with Jeskan to insure proper paperwork for his SLDP student application. **Legislative chair:** I have not had any ASRT CRTA meetings since the last board meeting. I have monitored Kansas legislation; nothing has affected us. And I have answered several emails concerning noncertified people performing radiologic technologist duties. **Senior delegate:** I attended the ASRT House of Delegates in Reno, where I attended the educational symposium all mandatory events, and the MRI, Education, and RA chapter meetings. For our main meeting our largest discussion and vote was on the wording of the practice standards to include LGBTQIA+ specifically. This was to ensure this particular group was included and not discriminated against. There were several amendments and breaks for discussions. The final vote of approval was for a statement pretty much like the original statement. ASRT is collaborating with several partners to come to a more universal statement all can agree on. Also up for discussion for several years now was the qualifications to be an ASRT delegate, which again did not pass. In the MRI meeting, remote scanning was the biggest discussion and the safety issues surrounding it. In the Education meeting, discussion revolved around making radiography a bachelor's degree program, the need for educators, adding more education for diverse populations, and educators certification exam and enrollment. The RA meeting discussed the lack of available programs (only 5) licensure, employment (lots of jobs available now but not enough RAs), MARCA and changing the practice standards for RAs.

**Harmony Ibarra, vice-president and membership chair:** Since the summer board meeting, I have brainstormed ideas with Kyle Ibarra for the membership drive flyer and new member recruitment. I also am working through a list of members who have allowed their memberships to lapse. I am emailing them to inquire about why they did not remain a member and if they have ideas for the KSRT. I



am also including information for the annual conference in Wichita.

**Shanna Bennett, secretary-treasurer:** I submitted the June 17 meeting minutes and uploaded them to the Google Drive, submitted the Special Email Request minutes and uploaded them to the Google Drive, searched for speakers for the 2024 KSRT convention, and reviewed the Sept. 9 meeting agenda.

**Jeskan McGovern, director at large:** In the past few months, I have sent an example of code of conduct for attending the annual KSRT conference to the president, contacted students who may be interested in becoming KSRT student representatives, contacted Becky Dodge to ask how to assist with KSRT convention in Wichita, and actively distributed the form required for those interested in speaking at the KSRT convention in Wichita.

**Tara Rohn, professional development chair:** Since the summer board meeting, I have setup a dedicated professional development Gmail account to help organize entries. I have continued to work with the vice chair to update the rules for competitions, which will be sent for publication in the *Anode* and the website.

**Becky Dodge, education chair, and Dixie Copeland, education vice chair:** The education committee has requested bids for the 2025 convention from Manhattan and Junction City hotels, evaluated bids for 2025 convention sites and sent follow-up questions concerning individual bids, created a save-the-date notice for the 2024 convention in Wichita for the summer *Anode*, distributed the 2024 speaker form to board members, discussed opportunities with Jeskan to participate in convention planning activities, emailed the Drury Plaza Hotel Broadview to update it about the numbers from the 2023 convention in Hays, inquired about the number of vendor tables that can be accommodated, responded to ACE Team email communication about continuing the project (no meetings have been arranged), and secured a recorded CE presentation with approval to distribute as an ACE offering if the committee opts to continue this year.

**Kirsten Oswald, eastern area representative:** The past couple of months I have reached out to Heidi Chermak to gather a good email and phone number for communication. I also have taken a greater look at the counties in the eastern area and brainstormed different ways of reaching out to them. I also have been in touch with Becky Dodge regarding student activities and speakers at convention and brainstormed activities and speaker ideas for students, such as how to get CEUs, keep track of licensing, and renewal dates as a student. I reached out to student representative Ashton Kahrs to see if we could come up with some more ideas regarding students at convention.

**Kyle Ibarra, central area representative:** I attended ASRT House of Delegates in Reno as an alternate affiliate delegate and attended the MRI, CT, and Education chapter meetings. The main house meeting discussion revolved around adding language to our practice standard position statement that included LBGTQIA+ to insure they were not excluded and/or discriminated against. The MRI meeting discussed MRI safety and MRI devices and who could interrogate pacemakers in the MRI suite. The CT meeting had a long discussion with the military chapter and how hard it is for them to become ARRT-registered for radiography and CT as they either do not get the required associate's degree to take the radiography registry and or struggle to get the exams and educational requirements to take the CT registry. During the Education chapter meeting we had a lot of discussion on the use of Chat GPT. I have also been working on the membership drive flyer.

**Kelly Denton, western area representative:** Since the 2023 convention I have had a Zoom meeting with western area radiology managers, and we discussed staffing concerns, travel staff, new equipment/service in area, and concerns and issues about remote imaging reports. As far as vendors, I sent thank you emails out to all 2023 convention vendors, updated the forms to include meals and other donation options, and changed verbiage to say

"Contribute to meal/break" instead of "Sponsor a meal/break."

**Ashton Kahrs, student representative:** I have emailed students across Kansas about the convention, asked for speech suggestions and volunteers, told them about the scholarship and the student interns and representatives for next year, and talked to Kirsten Oswald and Becky Dodge about activities and topics at convention that students will like.

**Jen Smith, *The Rotating Anode* editor and media coordinator:** The summer issue of *The Rotating Anode* recently was published online and printed and mailed (17 copies to legacy members). Deadline for the fall issue will be Sept. 25. I also have made a few tweaks and updates to the website, most notably updating the convention information with the 2024 details. I also attended the ASRT House of Delegates meeting in June in Reno, Nevada, as chair of the CT chapter. I have reached out to Rich Bomgardner, director of the athletic training program at Wichita State, about speaking at our spring convention, and I need to send him the speaker's info form and get things more firmed up with him. But he is involved with the education/convention aspects of his own state professional society and understands the challenge of finding speakers, so he's a solid bet.

No comments or concerns regarding the consent agenda. Consent agenda accepted.

**Approval of minutes:** Toni motioned to approve the minutes from the June 17 meeting, Harmony seconded, motion passed.

**Reports:** The Board of Directors report was emailed to board members before the meeting.

**Financial report:** The financial report was available to board members before the meeting. Denise updated the report to include the \$5,000 received from ASRT. See updated financial report on Google Drive. Overall, the society is in great financial shape.

The student membership funds will

Toni motioned to approve the financial report, Jeskan seconded, no discussions, no extensions, motion passed.

### Old business

**Membership drive:** Harmony and Kyle found an image and uploaded it to Google Drive. Denise will work to find a way to add a referral box on Memberplanet. It may be difficult to track, and the easiest way is to change the renewal year.

Harmony asked if we were still offering the ACE (CEU's). Becky offered that we are waiting to hear back about whether this will continue.

Jeskan suggested the KSRT website link be included on the membership flier. We will look at changing the color for ADA purposes.

Harmony is not emailing lapsed members at this time until we figure out the plan for the flier.

The *Anode* due date is Sept. 25, and they will work on getting fliers updated by then.

Kyle moved to approve the wording for the membership drive (refer two new members get a free membership for the following year). We also will add a statement that membership will be verified before the free year will be given. Toni seconded the motion. No further discussion. Motion passed.

**Review 2018 policies and procedures document:** Denise will clean up the policy and procedures document and place it on Google Drive.

**Student interns:** Ashton emailed students but haven't gotten any replies. Toni talked to students about KSRT. Ashton will email program directors. Tara will email contacts to Ashton and Ashton will resend emails.

**Silent auction:** Toni to put a list of silent auction duties for a possible new leader. She will put the list on Google Drive.

**and updates:** Tara continued to make changes to digital to make things more smooth, created a Google form, and created a dedicated email address (KSRTProfDev@gmail.com). Arrica is working on a flier for competition and will send it to Jen Smith for the Anode and website and to program directors.

**Convention vendors:** Kelly re-vamped the vendor form to include a \$15 lunch option. She will send those out soon. She also is looking at the vendor bingo cards to allow for more student engagement instead of handing out stickers. Kirsten will continue to brainstorm ideas. Jeskan suggested adding prompts for students on bingo cards.

Jeskan will update the Code of Conduct and make a document and put it on Google Drive.

**2024 convention:** The convention will be April 4-6 at Drury Plaza Broadview Hotel in Wichita. Dixie had someone create several graphics for Piloting the Future brochure. The graphic with the airplane was chosen as the logo. We still desperately need speakers. Nov. 1 was the deadline for speaker forms and Dec. 1 for sending them in to get ASRT CE approval. Becky suggested a vote on a \$15 fee increase. Harmony motioned to set convention fees as presented for the 2024 KSRT convention. Gale second the motion. No discussion. Motion passed. The 2024 service project is Lexi's Lamb Foundation and has a pantry for families. Wesley needs crocheted IV wraps. Katilyn will send an address and make a Facebook post.

**2025 KSRT convention ideas:** Becky has received bids and the Hilton Garden Inn seems the most realistic. Becky will share with Denise and Toni once we get a contract from Hilton Garden Inn in Manhattan.

**2024 ASRT House of Delegates:** Toni will be senior delegate and Denise will be junior delegate. We need two alternate delegates. Gale and Jeskan agreed to be alternate delegates.

**Rotating Anode:** The deadline is Sept. 25. Kelly will put together a word

search and crossword search for National Radiology Tech Week.

**CD renewal:** A CD renewal is coming due Nov. 15. We need to decide what changes to make, if any, before they renew at the current rate of 0.803%. Toni motioned to close the CD at 1st National Bank and buy a new one for 14 months at 5.5% at Sunflower Bank. Dixie second the motion. No discussion. Motion passed.

**Jen Smith grad school capstone project:** Jen looked into surveys which are pricey, \$1,000 to \$10,000. Katilyn suggested utilizing free options like a LinkedIn account, TikTok, and maybe create a poll on Facebook page. Becca asked if KSRT can create a community page on ASRT.org. Katilyn thinks maybe Memberplanet has something like a community page. Katilyn will follow up. There is a discussion forum on Memberplanet. Toni and Katilyn will reach out to Jen to brainstorm ideas. Continue to think of ways to increase KSRT memberships.

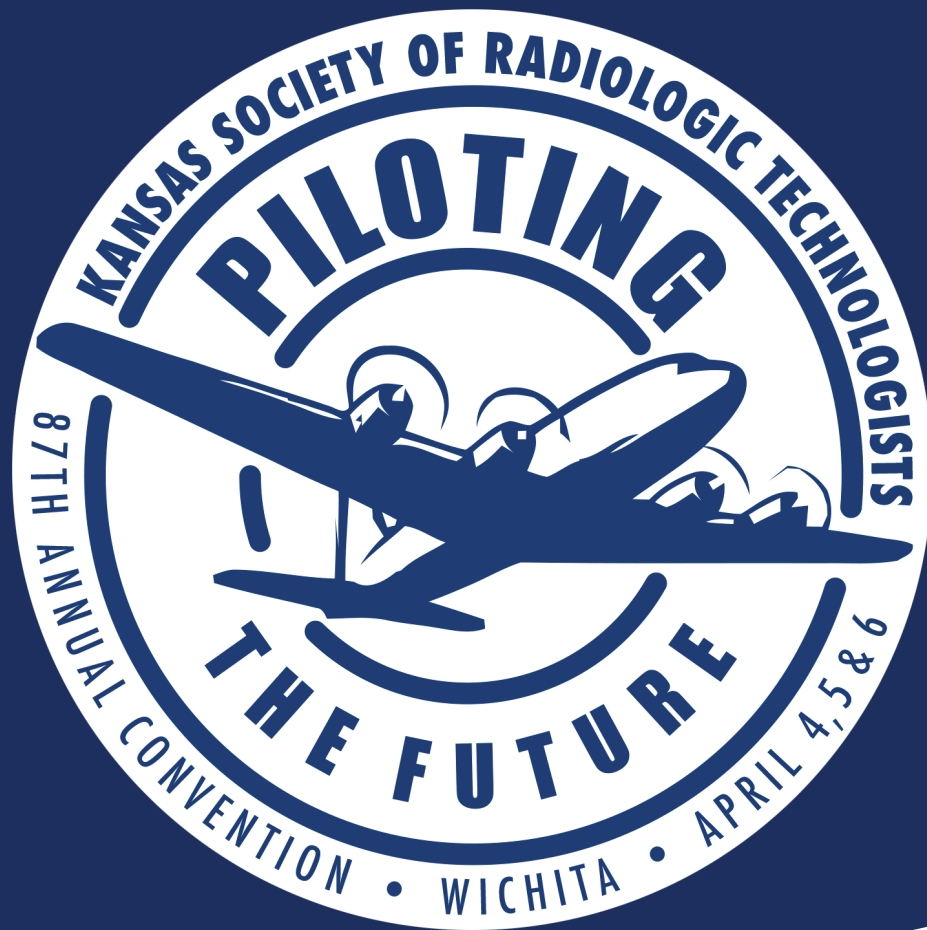
When registering to attend the KSRT Conference, attendees agree to the following expectations:

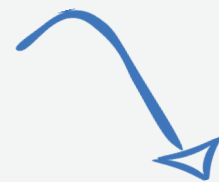

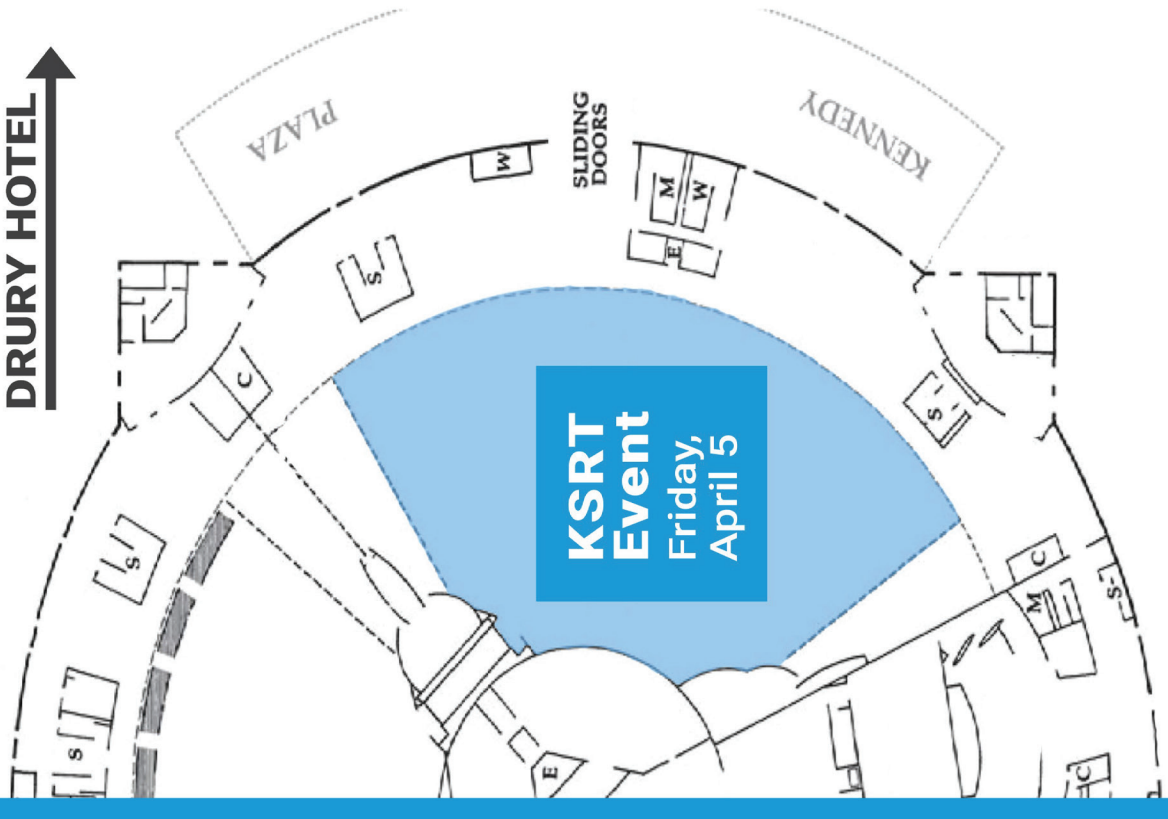

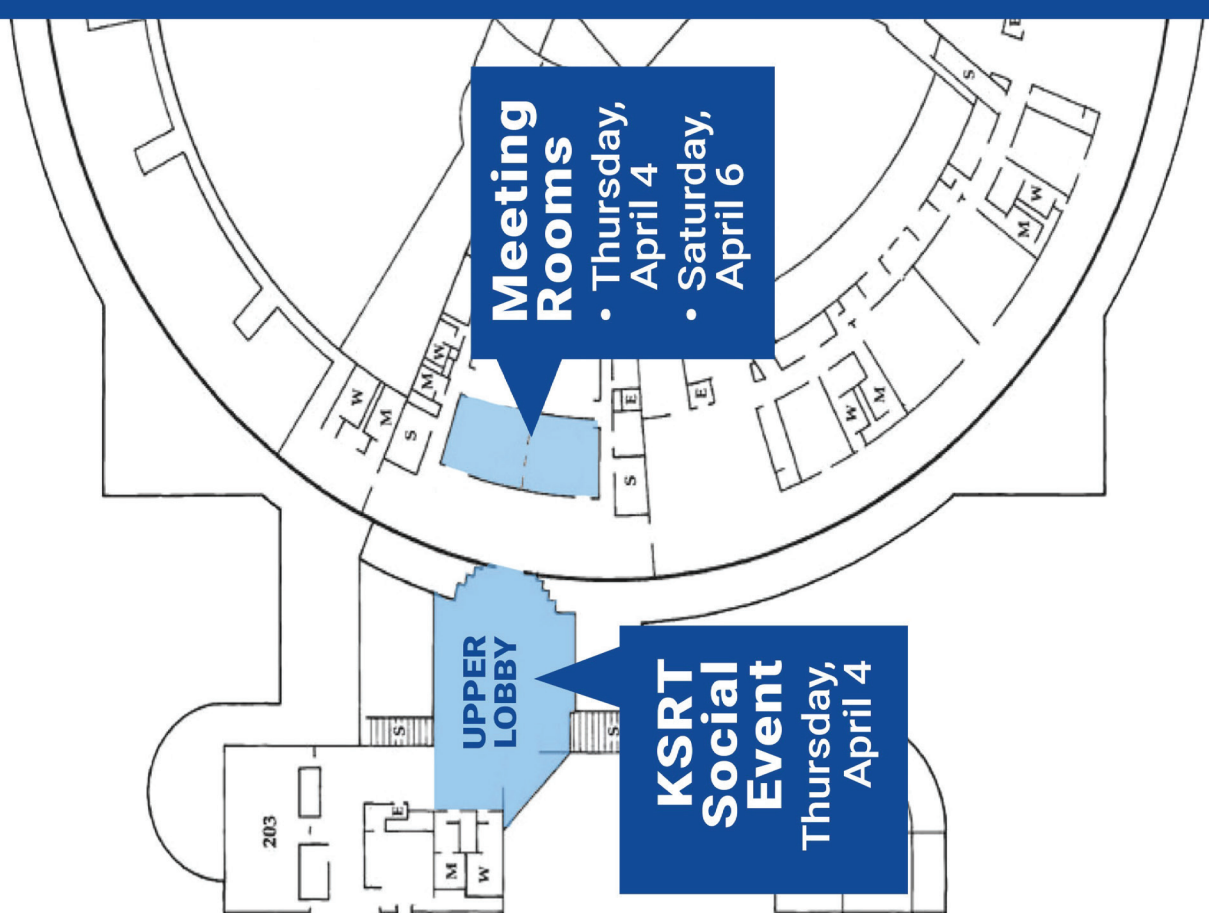
